

Trey White Signs with Glenville State

Former Greenbrier East linebacker/fullback Trey White will continue his education and football career at Glenville State College.

White recently signed with the Pioneers and will report to camp July 29, in time for the summer practice sessions at the Gilmer County-based college.

A projected linebacker for Pioneers coach Alan Fiddler's system, White was named a First Team All-Coalfield Conference selection for Greenbrier East in 2003, while earning his team's Defensive Player of the Year in 2000, 2002, and 2005.

As a senior on the 2004 Spartan football team, White led the team with 51 tackles, 39 assists, five sacks, five tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, and one blocked kick. He was a three-year letterman for the Greenbrier East squad.

"I think Glenville State got a steal," said Spartan head coach and former Pioneer lineman Andy Grogg. "Trey's a tough player, who has improved his strength and speed this past winter. If he sticks with it, he will play at Glenville State."

He graduated from Greenbrier East High School on June 3 with a 3.25 grade point average. White was a member of the Future Farmers of America, and was twice honored with the Greenbrier Award for Academic Improvement.

White, son of Charley and Debbie White of White Sulphur Springs and Mike and Rhonda Hager of Triadelphia, plans to major in Forestry and Wildlife Management.
